#### **OUR NEW PRESIDENT**

Peter was born at Five Dock NSW on 18 July 1927. He was the only child of James William George Christian (born Parramatta) — (FF William Tunks) and Vivienne May (nee Prosser) (born Crookwell NSW). Four generations of the family have been pharmacists. He was educated at Double Bay Public, Randwick High and Sydney Grammar Schoois. He attended Sydney University and gained his Ph.C. in 1952. He married Joy Noelle Hammond (born Temora 25/12/1933) at St James', King St. in 1954. Joy is a great-great-granddaughter of Matthew James Everingham and a kinswoman of the explorer Charles Sturt. They have a daughter, Amanda Jane Louise, and three sons —Timothy James Andrew, Matthew Peter John and Nicholas Stephen Charles, and have 1½ grandchildren.

Whilst their children were growing, both Peter and Joy were involved in community affairs; both are Life Members of Kingsgrove P.C. Association and Newington College P. and F. Both have received award badges for services to scouting. In 1980 Peter sold the family business and moved to Cheltenham. A serious illness necessitated open heart surgery that year, and whilst recuperating, at Joy's encouragement, he took up the hobby of genealogy, and to date has completed about 17 volumes of family profiles, nine of which concentrate fully on his First Fleet Tunks family.

In perfect health, Peter now leads a full and active life. His hobbies, other than family history and Australian history in general, are gardening, bush walking and skiing. He is a keen collector of books and has a sizeable library. Besides his membership of various historical societies, and his obvious commitment to our Fellowship, Peter also has the honour of being a foundation member of the Sydney University Pharmacy Alumni Council and, an even more rare honour, of being a Trustee of St James' Church, King Street, Sydney.

He looks forward to the challenge of leading the Fellowship into our Nation's Bicentennial year and will do his utmost to ensure that due recognition will be given to those pioneers, both bonded and free, who arrived in January 1788.

### Researching your F.F. Marine?

The Royal Marine Museum, Portsmouth, has informed the Fellowship that it is regretfully unable to give much assistance in research on F.F. Marines. The practice of keeping records of service for officers was not instituted until 1793. The Navy List does not provide much information re officers of the Marines and Royal Marines of late 18th and early 19th centuries either, for their "stations" (ships in which they were serving) were not published until 1809.

Information may be obtained from "List of Officers of His Majesty's Marine Forces", and various histories of the Marines.

For non-commissioned ranks, they recommend you obtain a photocopy of the "Effective List of the Non-Commissioned Officers, Drummers and Private Marines", of the four Companies during duty in N.S.W. from 1st July to 30th Sept. 1788, from —

The Public Record Office, at Ruskin Avenue, Kew, Richmond, Surrey, TW9 4DU. (Ref: ADM 1/3824)

For quick reference, "Historical Records of N.S.W." (Charles Potter Sydney, 1893) Vol. 2, pages 414-417, gives a copy of the List, without the company numbers, which are essential for detailed research. The company numbers can be used to discover the division to which the non-commissioned man belonged.

## EUROPEAN ROCK CARVINGS AND THE FREDERICK MEREDITH FAMILY GROUP

The abovenamed family group, which is still in its formative stages, held a gathering in January on Garden Island.

Nearly forty people, which was considered encouraging (as the Group has hardly got going yet) attended.

The Public Relations Officer for Garden Island was most attentive and conducted the party to, and gave a brief address on, the historic stone which bears the initials "FM" and the date 1788. These initials are accepted as having been carved by Frederick Meredith who arrived with the First Fleet as Steward to Captain John Marshall on the transport "Scarborough".

Meredith transferred to HMS Sirius in March 1788 and was a baker (today we would probably say "cook") on that ship until it was wrecked on Norfolk Island.

Most members will know that Garden Island received its name from the vegetable gardens made by sailors off the "Sirius" — most likely assisted by some convicts, as was the wont in those days.

Several sets of initials have been discovered on the rocks on the island but those of Frederick Meredith are the only ones to be identified with any certainty. For those members of the group who had not previously seen the initials it was an exciting experience.

The initials are of interest to all historical minded people as they are regarded by the Navy as the earliest evidence still existing of European settlement in Sydney.

The day was made even more interesting and pleasant as the Harbour, as only it can, put on all its glory and activity on a beautiful sunny Sunday. A sight that must surely be unsurpassed.

#### **GRAVES COMMITTEE REPORT**

On Sunday 15th September 1985, the plaque dedication project reached a total of forty plaques placed on the graves of First Fleeters. The fortieth was placed on the grave of Ann Huxley (nee Forbes) who died 29 December 1851, and is buried at Sackville Reach cemetery.

The ceremony started with the afternoon service at St Thomas' Church of England, Sackville. After the church service, a delightful afternoon tea was served by the local Ladies' Auxiliary. We then journeyed to the cemetery for the plaque dedication service. The retiring President, Roderick Best, started proceedings by introducing the Fellowship and giving a short history of this project. He was followed by Bruce Arnett, a sixth generation descendant of Ann Huxley, who gave a speech on the life and experience of his First Fleeter ancestor.

The Rev. Kevin Johnson then gave a short prayer. Councillor Rex Stubbs from Hawkesbury Shire Council, after a short speech, raised the St Anne's flag which covered the tombstone.

After the service, descendants of Ann Huxley congregated behind the tombstone for friends and relatives to take historical photos. There were people with tape recorders, movie cameras, video cameras and countless still cameras photographing possibly the largest group of descendants that has attended these dedication services since we started the project.

The next plaque dedication services are on Sunday 20th October 1985. The first service is at the graveyard opposite St Peter's Church of England, Windsor Road, Richmond, after the 10am morning service for Mariner Thomas Spencer. This will be followed by a picnic lunch down by the Hawkesbury River.

The second service will be at the Castlereagh Cemetery at Church Lane, off Castlereagh Road, Castlereagh, around 3pm, for Elizabeth Rope nee Pulley.

Please join us on the 20th October 1985 for either or both of these dedication services.

Member No. 1977, Mr Ken Huxley has written as follows: "You raised a question in the August/September Newsletter asking whether any member had thoughts on the Oldest First Fleeter at death.

My ancestor, James Shiers, who arrived on the "Scarborough" was born in England in June 1835 and died at Captain John Piper's property, 'Alloway Bank', Bathurst, on 17th December, 1838, was aged 103, so I think that he must have been nearly the oldest at death".
