FIRST FLEETERS WHO DIED IN TASMANIA

Members will be aware that the Fellowship has been active for some time locating the graves of First Fleeters and attaching plaques indicating that the deceased had arrived in Australia with the First Fleet. Already, most cemeteries in the environs of Sydney have been done and a couple of plaques have been attached overseas, at Norfolk Island and in England.

It is well known that a number of First Fleeters found their way to Tasmania and some research has been done in this regard. The following alphabetical listing shows the names of persons who died in Tasmania whose names are the same as persons known to have arrived with the First Fleet, whose ages at death indicate that they could have arrived with the First Fleet. Identified First Fleeters are shown by the letters FF against their names in the left hand margin. Those who have had momunents erected on their graves are indicated by the letter M in the right hand margin. It will be noted that the names are predominantly male.

The Graves Committee of the Fellowship is anxious to obtain positive identification of these possible First Fleeters and information as to the location and inscriptions of monuments locating their burial places. The Fellowship would be very grateful to anybody writing to the Honorary Secretary with information which could be helpful.



THE FOLLOWING IS THE EULOGY GIVEN BY MICHELLE HATGOOD AT THE GRAVE OF JOHN GOWEN FF, CHRIST CHURCH KIAMA 20TH APRIL, 1986.

John Gowen was born in England around 1763, he enlisted in the Marines in 1778 and sailed aboard the H.M.A.S. Sirius to Australia as a Corporal of Marines.

John made two trips to Norfolk Island as part of a marine detachment. In November 1791 John had requested permission to leave the Marines and was honourably discharged. He settled as a marine-settler at Norfolk Island and was given a landgrant of 60 acres at Phillipsburg Town. This grant was later listed as returned to the Government.

John returned to Sydney Town in November 1794 and joined the N.S.W. Rum Corps as a non-commissioned officer — he served for 5 years and then resigned. He was offered and accepted the position as the Official Government Storekeeper.

On the 1st June 1805 John married a convict Ordery Appleyard. Ordery, sometimes also known as Appleford had arrived on the Earl of Cornwallis in June 1801.

John and Ordery had five daughters and one son between May 1806 and April 1816.

John had been granted land in Sydney, Liberty Plains, Bankstown, Prospect Creek (where the Carramar railway station now stands), Minto and Petersham Hill, the latter was surrendered back to the Government. He requested permission to resign his position of storekeeper in Sydney so he could take up his grant of land at Liverpool. The family moved from Sydney Town to Liverpool where John again became storekeeper. The Gowan family lived on their property on the corner of Elizabeth and George Streets.

Ordery passed away on the 17th October 1819 at the age of 41 and is buried in the Pioneer Memorial Cemetery at Liverpool.

John and Ordery's eldest daughter Mary married in 1821 to Sergeant William Henry Jones of the 48th Regiment. They later transferred to Gibraltar, India and then New Zealand, they had two children.

John married for the 2nd time on the 27th November 1821 to another convict, Mary Wood who had been transported aboard the William Pitt and arrived in Sydney in 1808. This union didn't produce any children.

John asked to retire from public office (he was employed at the Parramatta stores) and this he did in late 1822 early 1823 after 40 years service to his country. By now John was

In 1824 John's daughter Ann married George Taber. They had nine children.

John's wife Mary passed away on 29th June 1827 when she was 53 and she is also buried in the Pioneer Memorial Cemetery at Liverpool.

In 1829 John's daughter Frances married the Reverend William Sutherland and as far we know there was no issue.

John continued to live at Liverpool with his only unmarried daughter Elizabeth looking after him. His son, John lived at home also, the other daughter died in infancy.

John's life was very quiet in the latter part and he died, not at Liverpool where he was assumably living; but here at Kiama, on the 28th April, 1837. He had spent over 40 years in Australia. It is a mystery still as to what John was doing in Kiama (so far from "home") at the age of 74 years.

John's daughter, Elizabeth married Joseph Hush in 1850 and again we're not sure of issue. John Jnr. married Mary Ann Smith in 1844; she was the daughter of Jeremiah Smith (convict from the William Pitt, 1791) and Sophia Acres (who was the daughter of a first fleet convict, Thomas Acres).

John Jnr. and Mary Ann had 10 children — from whom my family is descended.

I am a 6th generation Australian descended from John Gowen Snr. and a 7th generation through my mother's side, also back to Thomas Acres.
